DIRECTIONS

INSPECT LEASH AND COLLAR BEFORE EACH USE



Make sure that all parts of the leash and your dog's collar are in good condition. If any part of the leash or your dog's collar are damaged, fraved or broken, do not use the leash.

ATTACHING THE LEASH



Attach the

hook of the

leash to the

dog's collar.

Make sure that the hook is fully closed and securely attached to the collar D-ring.

DISCONNECTING THE LEASH

Make sure your dog is under control. Fully retract the leash and lock it before detaching it.

BEFORE USE

Before each use, thoroughly inspect your leash and your pet's collar to ensure that all parts are in working order and not damaged in any way. Read all instructions and warnings and refer to diagrams.

WHAT TO DO IF THE TAPE GETS WET

Pull the tape out of the leash housing as far as it will go and lock the brake. Leave it to dry overnight in a place that is out of reach of children. When the tape is dry, carefully and slowly retract the leash to keep it under control.

CLEANING AND STORING YOUR LEASH

To clean your leash, use a damp cloth, and only wash the case of the leash. Store your leash out of the reach of children and pets. The foam handle is especially attractive to children and pets who enjoy chewing. We want you to have a long lasting leash, while ensuring the safety of pets and people.

USING THE LEASH

Always hold the leash by the handle, never by the tape. Never tie leash around a tree, pole, or any other object.

LOCKING AND UNLOCKING THE LEASH

To stop your pet, use your thumb and press down on the larger button directly on top of the leash. To unlock the leash, press down on the smaller button located directly on top of the leash. If the leash is in the locked position, the smaller button should be protruding slightly above the larger button. Be aware that when the leash is locked your leash may have slack, which could present a hazard to your pet or people in the vicinity. Please watch your pet at all times and appropriately unlock the leash to allow it to retract any slack in the tape. Lock the leash again when the slack is gone and the leash tape is taut.

TO BRING YOUR DOG NEARER

follow thes steps and never touch the tape:



1 Extend your arm forward and press the brake button.



2 Step toward vour dog and at the same time bring vour arm to vour



Press the brake release button and swing your arm towards your dog and press the brake button again.

4 Repeat as needed.

LIMITED WARRANTY

This WalkWhiz Foam Leash is warranted to the original owner against manufacturing defects in materials and workmanship for the lifetime of the product. The WalkWhiz Leash branded retractable leash products are covered by a two-year warranty that protects the original owner against manufacturing defects in materials and workmanship. If the leash fails due to a manufacturing defect, we will repair the product, without charge, or replace it at our discretion. Only original, unaltered and unmodified materials and workmanship are covered by this policy. This warranty does damage caused by accident, care, negligence, normal wear and tear, or CHEWING. Damage not covered warranty may be repaired for a reasonable rate and a fee will be charged for return shipping.

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STOP - READ THIS BEFORE USE

Because this leash is retractable, it requires special precautions to reduce the risk of injury. Read this pamphlet before using your leash and save it for future reference.

SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS

WHO CAN USE THIS LEASH?

This leash should only be used by responsible adults who have read and can follow all of these precautions. Anyone who uses this leash must be able to control the dog and watch the dog closely at all times to keep it from running off or wrapping anyone in the tape. Keep out of reach of children. Never let anyone play with this leash.

IS THIS LEASH RIGHT FOR YOUR DOG?

- · Do not use this leash with a disobedient or uncontrollable dog, since they are more likely to wrap the tape around people or to run off at high speeds.
- · Only use this leash with a dog that does not exceed the weight limit listed on the leash.
- · Even small dogs can pull hard enough to injure you, particularly because the length of the leash allows dogs to run and build up speed. Follow all of these precautions even with a small dog.

CONSIDER WHERE YOU WILL GO

You can use the retractable leash anywhere you would normally go with your dog. However, the leash is designed to give your dog more freedom while on a leash. For example, if you go to the vet, groomer or any crowded place, you cannot give your dog the

additional freedom. You need to have the leash fully retracted and the brake locked. (Please refer to paragraph "Injury to Bystanders"). You may want to consider using a regular, non retractable leash in these circumstances.

USE THIS LEASH ONLY AS INTENDED

- · Follow the "Directions" section in this pamphlet.
- · Never attach more than one dog to the leash. Never use more than one leash
- leash at a time · Never attach any accessories to the leash housing.

CUTS AND BURNS

If the tape runs across your skin, it can cause abrasions (like a rope burn) or severe cuts. Cuts and burns are more likely if the tape wraps around any part of the body.

Avoid contact with the tape and never let it wrap around any part of your body.



- Do not allow slack to build up in the tape you might get tangled in the slack.
- · Do not touch the tape if the tape wraps around you. Turn around or pass the handle from one hand to the other to unwrap yourself. (See "Finger Amputation and Fractures")
- · If you want to further reduce the risk of cuts and burns, you can wear long sleeves and pants to protect your arms and leas.

FINGER AMPUTATION AND FRACTURES



- · If the tape wraps around fingers or catches on a ring. a hard pull on the leash can amputate fingers or break
- · Avoid touching the tape when the leash is attached to your dog and never let the tape wrap can happen even when the leash is locked. around hands or fingers.

- Do not hold the tape.
- · Do not grab the tape to control your dog.
- If the tape gets entangled in a bush or other object, gain control of your dog before disentangling it. Do not touch the tape if your dog can pull on it.
- · If you want to further reduce the risk of finger amputation and fractures, you can take off any rings and wear sturdy gloves.

EYE AND FACE INJURIES



If the leash or your dog's collar breaks, or if the leash disconnects from your dog's collar, the tape and hook can snap back with enough force to cause serious eye damage, broken teeth, cuts, and bruises. If the tape is under enough tension, this

FALLS



Because this leash is longer than regular leashes, your dog can build up more speed and pull on it harder, possibly pulling you to the ground.

- · If your dog starts running away from you, immediately press the brake button to keep your dog from building up too much speed. If your dog has already built up speed, you will be pulled when you hit the brake or if the dog reaches the end of the leash.
- Do not allow slack to build up in the tape your dog may run and build up speed until the slack runs out, suddenly pulling you.
- · Have secure footing. Do not use the leash while on wheels (for example, a bike, skateboard or roller blades).

INJURIES TO BYSTANDERS



Bystanders are at risk of all of the injuries described in this pamphlet. In particular, they can be cut by the tape if they contact it or if it wraps around them. They might also trip on the leash. Bystanders include runners, people on skates or bikes. Pay special attention to bystanders as they may approach at high speeds.

- · When around other people or animals, shorten the leash and keep your dog at your side with the leash locked.
- · Avoid using this leash near children, including children in strollers
- · If the tape gets wrapped around someone, tell them not to touch the tape. Gain control of your dog and do not touch the tape if your dog can pull on it.
